# Hope Abounds at Camp Hope by Meredith Hutchens


Camp Hope 2022 was the highlight of the summer for over two hundred HFHC-sponsored teens! HFHC's Haiti staff, led by Johnny Laine Evenson (Camp Hope Director) and Roolite Religieux (Camp Hope Spiritual Director), conducted camp this year at Thomazeau and at Cazeau in two separate sessions. Campers at both venues enjoyed games and activities, Bible classes and discussion groups, delicious meals, and leisure time together.

This year's theme was *The Giver* and provided students with a Biblical focus of God as the giver of "new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1). Campers explored together, in Bible lectures, classes, and discussion groups, God's holiness and generosity in the ways *He Gives Life* 

(Lesson 1), He Gives Hope (Lesson 2), He Gives His Son (Lesson 3), and He Gives Transformation (Lesson 4). Nineteen campers gave their lives to Christ in baptism during Camp Hope 2022, while countless others were strengthened in their faith. (cont...page 2)



### From Despair to Hope by Rob Long

Sometimes it takes encountering despair to appreciate hope. I learned this lesson on my first trip to Haiti (2006).

The trip's initial hours were a shock to my system. After landing, my group successfully bounced through the pinball machine that is the Port-au-Prince airport. Then, we got on a bus headed toward the Cazeau orphanage. I had been on mission trips before, but after minutes in Port-au-Prince, I could tell this was different. The despair was palpable.

Sitting on the bus, I thought: "What am I doing here? Can I go home?

This is futile." I pressed my forehead again.

This is futile." I pressed my forehead against the window and cried. I was overwhelmed by what I saw.

After a couple days, our group visited the HFHC school in the impoverished community Cite Soleil. Entering Cite Soleil on that same bus, looking through the same window, I saw sad eyes on downcast faces. I was overwhelmed again.

After a short drive, we arrived at HFHC's Cite Soleil school and I saw smiles and light-filled eyes. I could feel the warmth and joy of the students and teachers. I remember playing, laughing, and taking pictures with the kids. I talked with them using the Creole phrases I had learned. Unsurprisingly, they couldn't understand my "Creole". But, through smiles and hugs, we communicated enough. The difference between the HFHC school children and those I saw along the road was simply this: Hope! Hope entered their world and blossomed into joy, warmth, purpose, and even laughter. The Hebrews writer envisioned hope as "an anchor for the soul."

Stepping foot on that school property, I witnessed how these Haitian children, vulnerable to life's storms, were now firmly anchored in hope.



At the week's end, I sat on the same bus headed to the airport. I pressed my forehead against the same window observing the same scene. Whereas at the start of the week, I asked myself, "What am I doing here?" while wishing I could go home, this time I asked, "When can I come back?" Because when you see hope's impact so vividly, you long

for more. And, I cried again. But this time my were tears saturated with hope. Hope for Haiti's Children is in the hope-giving business.


That's why I'm now honored to work for HFHC. There is no amount of despair and injustice that God's hope cannot break through and transform. Yes, even for Haiti.



I believe when a person has hope, they are a force to be reckoned with. So, keep sharing hope. And it may change a life... even yours.





# Project Hope Construction Efforts Nearing Completion at HFHC Christian Schools! by Ken Bever

Project Hope is our 10-year plan to strengthen the programs and services provided to all our sponsored children. Educationally, we want to improve learning opportunities for our children by building individual, brightly lit classrooms for each grade in every school rather than continuing to have schools where grades share an auditorium with partitions. In addition, we want to build two new schools one in Hinche and one in Mirebalais - and add classrooms to other schools so that all our sponsored children can attend an HFHC-affiliated Christian high school in their area.

Early this year, we were blessed to receive a \$500,000 matching grant from the Kemper Foundation. I am thrilled to announce that on July 18, thanks to many of you who gave toward this grant, we received 100% of the matching dollars needed so that all planned school construction projects could move forward

while school was out this summer. These construction projects not only bless our students but also bless local churches. The school facility serves as a meeting place for the church of Christ and their outreach efforts to the community. In addition, many church members with skills are hired to help with the construction effort and this provides members with vital income to support their families.

One major effort this summer was to construct a new building for the Hinche Christian School. Despite security and inflation challenges, this project is on track to be completed before school starts this fall! Another major project nearing completion is the 10th grade classroom at the Thomazeau Christian Secondary School, along with offices, a library, and a computer lab. Other efforts to add classrooms are underway at Cazeau, Delmas, Dubuisson, Brajirois, Robert, and Cite Soleil.



All told, thanks to our Project Hope donors, we have invested \$694,000 year to date in school capital improvements. Additional funds are urgently needed and will be put to use immediately (see below for some specific areas Project Hope donations will be utilized).
